LINC Level vs. Software Level

Each LINC level lists the computer skills that a learner needs to accomplish for that level. The suggested skills are the minimum set of skills that a learner must master. Since learners have diverse abilities and backgrounds, it is possible to have some whose computer skills exceed their language abilities. As a result, you may find that you need to teach at a higher or lower level than recommended in this guide. Use the Computer Skills Checklist in the Additional Resources section to assist you in evaluating your learners' computer level. Teach the skills that your learners are comfortable with, NOT the recommended LINC level if your learners' skill levels are lower. For example, after evaluating your LINC Three class, you may decide that they need to start at LINC One computer level. As a LINC Instructor, ensure that learners can comfortably use the features of the software in a specific level. It is at your discretion whether to teach the skills listed in higher levels. The following table illustrates an overview of the skills recommended for each software package. See Skills Checklist for a more detailed list.

The Skills Checklist in each LINC level expands on the one in the previous level; e.g., LINC Two checklist expands on the skills in LINC One. The new skills at each level appear highlighted. The suggested activities complement the curriculum content and reinforce the software skills discussed in that level.
